# Report from the Church Office

## SPRC Announcement

As you may have heard by now, Pastor Diana Lucas will be leaving Ash Creek and Willow Valley at the conclusion of June this year. She will be moving on to the First United Methodist Church in Baraboo this July, allowing her to stay in the Driftless Region she has come to love. We wish her the best on this next stage of her life and ministry!

The ACWC church Staff and Parish Relations Committee (SPRC) has been working diligently with the Wisconsin Conference to find a new pastor, and we are pleased to announce Rev. Grace Cho. Rev. Cho has a Master of Divinity (MDiv) and a Master of Theological Studies (MTS) from Chandler School of Theology (the theology school of Emory University in Atlanta, Georgia). She is also just short of a PhD in theology from Northwestern University in Chicago. However, rather than finishing her PhD, she felt called to serve the local church, and was appointed through the United Methodist system to a series of rural churches in northeastern Wisconsin, serving in the area for about 6 years. She is moving to the Driftless Area for the first time, ready to serve our churches starting July 1.

Along with this new pastor comes a number of other logistical changes. In order to better manage our finances, the SPRC, along with the mentorship of our District Superintendent Amanda Stein, has elected to perform a "trial run" of joining the Ash Creek and Willow Valley circuit with the existing Richland Center UMC (formerly Trinity). This means that, for the next year, Rev. Cho will be serving as the pastor of a three-church, or "three-point," circuit. Should this experiment prove

successful, this would aim to be the new normal.

At the current time, there are still some logistical questions to be worked out, and the SPRC of all three churches are working diligently to resolve them. Our SPRC's current chair Marty Richards's goal, affirmed by Rev. Cho's willingness, is to have all three churches continue to have Sunday services as they currently do; however, this will very likely mean that service times will change. Even in the context of three church services, this is not totally unfamiliar territory; as some of you may remember, Willow Valley used to be in a three-point charge with the Loyd and Sextonville churches (briefly between 1967 and 1970, back when WV was still called the Ithaca United Brethren Church), and that pastor used to serve three Sunday morning services - one at each church. Because this has been done before, there are some existing models that we can learn from and reference. As these conversations are still ongoing, the office will notify everyone of that change once the details have been confirmed.

There are still many other questions about how this new system will work; however, I'd also like to confirm a few things that won't change:

- The role of the Ash Creek/Willow Valley Office will remain unchanged for the duration of this trial run; I (Logan) will still be serving the churches through all necessary office duties, and will still be serving them in the Willow Valley church building's office.
- This also means that the Creeks & Valleys Newsletter that you all receive will continue unchanged.
- AC and WV Church leadership in the form of the Administrative Councils will also remain the same.

The AC/WV SPRC Committee will want to hear your feedback. Please feel free to reach out to any SPRC member to share your initial thoughts or any concerns you may have. The committee members include:

### Month in Review

May was an extremely busy month in the life of the church! On May 10, Ash Creek hosted its annual Mother-Child Luncheon. This year, the theme was “Timeless Traditions,” with butterfly imagery. At the same time, one of Ash Creek’s own was the recipient of a significant honor by the Wisconsin Conference of the UMC. Allen Unbehaun, an anchor of the Ash Creek congregation, was nominated for and won the Wisconsin United Methodist Foundation’s Lois C. Olsen Ministry of Memory Award. This was in recognition of Allen’s dedication to preserving the history of the Ash Creek church and community. A significant contribution Allen made to the preservation of Ash Creek’s history was in the book *Among the Hills of Ash Creek*, which he jointly compiled with Lila Sigrist in 1989; the text chronicles

the long and rich history of the Ash Creek area and the Orion township from its initial surveying in 1842 and its first European settlers shortly after all the way through the lineages of the many families that called Ash Creek their home. At Ash Creek, Allen was celebrated by Pastor Diana and the congregants with the presentation of a certificate during regular service (photo above), and the video of his receiving the certificate was shown at the Wisconsin Conference on June 6-8. Congratulations for the recognition of your work, Allen!

On May 14, Willow Valley hosted the Ithaca School District’s Baccalaureate service. The Baccalaureate service is hosted by either the Willow Valley Church or the Keyesville Catholic Church every other year, and 2025 was Willow Valley’s year. 


## Ithaca Baccalaureate Class of 2025
