I reflected on what it must have been like for these followers to have this unexpected time suddenly—this life after death, but on earth, where those around him experienced Jesus' presence. And then to lose Jesus a second time. How did the disciples meet this challenge? Meeting the risen Christ deepened their relationship with Jesus. The disciples were called to be witnesses, to tell the story of what they had seen. It is my hope that as we walk through these 50 Days of Easter, you realize that you too are just as much a witness of the Jesus story as those original followers. Your Easter experience is as authentic as theirs. If you were to reflect, you would see that your understanding of Jesus has changed over the years. Your faith has hopefully deepened, your understanding has grown, and your love for Christ and all he did for you is something you are truly grateful for.

We are Easter people, and for that I say Amen and Alleluia!

Our year-to-date expenses are now just slightly under our year-to-date revenue. As we've mentioned in prior columns, we have not paid our apportionments to the Wisconsin UMC Conference so far this year, as Pastor Diana submitted an application for "relief" from the Conference for our apportionments, and we are still awaiting a decision from them. The total that has been allocated to us for January-April is \$4,320.

At the WV Ad Council meeting earlier this week, we voted to pay the outstanding four months of apportionments from six months of proceeds of the Cattle Center. We offer a huge thank you to everyone who supports the Cattle Center lunch sales with their generous gifts of time and food!
