One of the teachers of the law came and heard them debating. Noticing that Jesus had given them a good answer, he asked him, “Of all the commandments, which is the most important?” The most important one,” answered Jesus, “is this: ‘Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.’ The second is this: ‘Love your neighbor as yourself.’ There is no commandment greater than these.” — Mark 12:28-31

Dear Family of Christ’s Church,

Many goals have been ascribed to the Christian spiritual life. These goals range from the glorification of God, union with Christ, love for God and love for neighbor, theosis (divinization), salvation, mystical union, imitation of Christ, beatific vision, sanctification of the soul, and others. But among these many theological concepts, love for God and love for neighbor remain pivotal. Jesus taught that if we love God with all our heart, all our soul, all our strength, and all our mind, then we will love our neighbor as ourselves as well.

John Wesley, the founder of the Methodist Church, held a conviction that we are bound to God through divine love and that this divine love invites us to participate in the life of the Triune God. As the three persons of the Trinity are bound together by divine love, so too are we bound to God and to one another through divine love. Love cannot remain turned inward on itself. Love calls us beyond ourselves. Love calls us into relationship with others and with the whole created world.

God’s love is not something we can keep to ourselves. Our love for God and for God’s children is shown through acts of service and mercy. There are many ways we can share God’s love. Sharing his Word, bearing witness to our faith, caring for the sick, visiting the homebound, praying for others, welcoming the stranger, and serving God through missions at home and abroad are all ways we share the love of Christ. Love compels us to care not only for those in our own congregation, but to care for the larger world as well, and so we are called into missions in a variety of ways.

There are many people in the world who are unable to cope with their hardships on their own. They need someone else’s help and care through their desperate times. So as John Wesley says:

*Do all the good you can
In all the ways you can
In all the places you can
At all the times you can
To all the people you can
For as long as ever you can!*

During this fall season, I pray that our hearts will be warmed by Christ’s love so we can share this love with our neighbors.

I have a personal update to inform you. I have now officially moved into the Baraboo area. This move has allowed my wife Chay to be closer to the Baraboo school district she is now teaching in, and the house we have bought, despite the labor we've had to put into renovating and updating it, is a cozy little place.

I want to thank everyone in the SPRC and the Ash Creek and Willow Valley leadership for their willingness, insight, and assistance that has allowed me to make this transition into a new chapter of my life as easy and as fulfilling as it has been.

Month in Review

Willow Valley's Growing in God (GIG) after-school youth program started back up! The first session of the 2025-2026 academic year was held on September 17. So far, we have 24 children and youth signed up ranging from Pre-K through to high school freshmen. A few photos of the September 17 session

Heather and the GIG staff arranged for a truck to drive in the parade celebrating the GIG program, and kids were invited to ride in the truck bed as well as walk alongside the truck. The Month Ahead

The churches are about to enter into their busiest ordinary season month, with two of the churches' largest events coming up.

Both churches will be hosting their annual Lord's Acre Dinners and Sales. Willow Valley's, organized by the WV United Methodist Men, will begin serving



food at 4:30pm. The menu will include chicken, mashed potatoes, and a variety of dessert bars. Simultaneous to the meal, there will be a silent auction on small items including homemade pies. The full auction will begin at 7:00pm. The flyer can be seen on page 6.

Ash Creek's Lord's Acre Dinner & Sale will be coming up the following weekend on October 25. Their dinner will start serving at 5:30pm. The sale will begin with a children-only auction at 6:30pm, and the full auction will begin at the children's auction's conclusion. The flyer can be seen on page 7.

Teri Richards' bible study sessions will be continuing on every Sunday at 9:30am up through the end of October. The final session will be on October 26. If you have any interest, come on by the Willow Valley church to participate!

Coming up in November, the churches' start times will be changing. After Ash Creek, Richland Center UMC, and Willow Valley came together to discuss, the plan is that a new arrangement of start times will begin on the All-Saints Sunday service on November 2. Willow Valley's service will start at 9:00am, Richland Center's will begin at 10:00am, and Ash Creek will begin at 11:00am. This is also the date that Daylight Savings Time ends, so be sure to change your clocks so you're not late to service!

Coming up on November 2, both churches will see the All-Saints Sunday service. Pastor Grace and the church office will be collecting the names of family members and friends who have entered into Heaven in the past year and lift up their names in celebration during this service. Candles will be lit for these individuals. If there are family or friends you want to lift up in this way, please fill out the information on the bottom of page 5 and submit it to the church office by phone, email, or into the

collection plate no later than October 29.

The Rest of the Year Ahead

Later on in November, Willow Valley will be hosting its annual Thanksgiving Ecumenical service. This is the service Willow Valley jointly holds with clergy and congregants from the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary Catholic Church in Keyesville. This year, the service will be held at Willow Valley. More details will be announced closer to the date.

The churches will also have their Charge Conference coming up before the end of the year. The date has not been set yet, but we are expecting that this date will be later in November or in early December—a bit later than in previous years. This gives the office and our leadership teams a little more time to work out all of the information we need to send, especially now that much of the information is split between three churches. All congregants are invited to attend; more information will be published once everything is confirmed.

In other area news, the Richland Concert Association will have two concerts coming up in October and November. Coming up on Sunday, October 12, the Wingra Wind Quintet will be performing. The Wingra Wind Quintet are comprised of the wind faculty members of the University of Wisconsin-Madison. Their repertoire for this concert is a particularly exciting round of contemporary music from some of the most talented living American-based composers, including former Los Angeles Philharmonic Music Director Esa-Pekka Salonen. However, a highlight from their performance will be a multi-movement wind quintet from Pulitzer Prize-winner John Harbison, a composer who has long-standing connections to the Madison area through his Madison-born wife Rose Mary Harbison. This is going to be a very personal

and very intriguing set of pieces that would show listeners new horizons in the classical music scene. The concert will be held October 12 at 2:00pm at the Seventh-day Adventist Church in Richland Center just off of Crestview Drive. Tickets can be purchased at the door for \$15 per adult or season tickets of \$50 per adult and \$80 per couple, and children and youth can always attend for free.

The Richland Concert Association's November 16 concert is also shaping up to be a fantastic highlight of local talents. Stephanie Pedretti is a flutist who has worked and lived in the Viroqua area for most of her career and will be performing with guitar. More information will be posted at a later time on the Richland Concert Association Facebook page, so follow them for further information on this and all the other 2025-2026 concerts.

Over the last few months, our trustees have been working hard to make minor renovations and repairs to the Willow Valley parsonage on Clary Lane so that we can rent it to a tenant. As many of you know, Pastor Grace is residing in the Richland Center UMC parsonage. To date, this remodeling work, cleaning costs, and monthly utilities total \$10,014.66. Just under half of this was paid from our parsonage fund, while the remaining \$5,570.86 was borrowed from the Willow Valley Fund. We expect this loan to be paid back from rental income in the first year. Kyle Dickey and Marty Richards took on the task of finding a suitable tenant; we expect the new tenants to move in around November 1. Thanks to Marty, Kyle, and the rest of the trustees for all of your hard work!

In our ongoing efforts to reduce expenses, we have switched our telephone and internet service providers from Frontier and Wi Connect to LaValle Telephone. We anticipate savings on the order of \$134 per month, or nearly half of our prior telephone/internet expense.

We are up-to-date on paying all of our bills with the exception, however, that we are slightly behind on apportionment payments to the Wisconsin Conference. Those are fully paid through the month of August.
